
Top 10 Ostomy Myths

Common misconceptions about having a stoma

Let's bust some ostomy myths.

"If the skin around the stoma is irritated, I should cut the size of the hole in the baseplate larger than the stoma size."



Fact #1

A snug fit between the skin barrier and the stoma with no skin showing is key to maintaining healthy skin. The hole in the skin barrier should not be cut too large with skin exposed which may become irritated and sore from contact with output.

Myth #2



"Leakage only occurs when my output overflows outside the baseplate."

Fact #2

Leakage occurs anytime ostomy output seeps under the skin barrier. Even a small amount of output close to the stoma can lead to skin complications which can get you caught in the damaging cycle of leakage and skin issues. This is why finding ostomy products with the right fit is important!

Myth #4



"Convex appliances can only by worn by people whose stoma is below the surface of the skin."

Fact #3


The pouch filter should never be pricked. If you have a 1-piece or 2-piece drainable pouch, you can release air by opening the pouch, or in a 2-piece mechanical coupling system you can disconnect the skin barrier and the pouch to release air. If the filter becomes blocked, you will need to change the pouch if you want its benefits.

Convex appliances may help ensure leakage prevention for people whose stoma is below the surface of the skin or is flush to the skin.

Myth #10


"I will have to purchase all my ostomy products with money out of my own pocket."

For public government funding, some provinces cover the full cost of ostomy supplies for certain individuals. Those with private insurance may be fully or partially covered for ostomy supplies.




